**The Brunswick Hotel was built soon after the Gardner House was destroyed by fire in 1886. It was located, very close, between the Methodist and the Episcopal Churches. Mr. and Mrs. George managed the Brunswick until 1890 when it changed to the Central House.**

**In 1892 it was the Johnson House and in 1898 it was again changed to the Guiford. The name and ownership changed again in 1906. It was then called Tremont House.**

**The hotel burned to the ground in 1912. The remains were purchased by Thomas Rowden who constructed a two story building, with a flat roof, calling it the Rowden Block.**
