Eames ...

*** Edwin F. Eames is a dynamo engineer at the water dept. He and Alice M. Eames have a house at 4 Highland Street. (1915)(1925)(1929-31)

*** George Eames is a sectionhand for the B&M RR. He rooms at E. F. Eame's on Highland Street (1915). George Eames was killed in a cave-in while repairing a sewer line near the hose house, in 1921.

*** Harold E. Eames is an assistant in the water district. Harold boards with Edwin Eames at 4 Highland Street. (1925) Harold is employed in Lynn, Mass. (1929-31)

*** Miss Margaret A. Eames is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding at Edwin Eames at 4 Highland Street. (1925) Margaret is a telephone operator at the White Mountain Telephone Company, 2nd floor, Odd Fellows Block, Pleasant Street. Margaret is boarding at Edwin Eames at 4 Highland Street. (1929-31)

*** Miss Mildred A. Eames is a stenographer, boarding at Edwin Eames at 4 Highland Street. (1925)

Eastern States Farmers Exchange ... Wright L. Towers, manager, dealing in feed and grain, etc., at 7 Forest Street. (1953 - 1958)



Eastman ...

*** Addie D. Eastman, widow of Oliver D. Eastman, has a home at 22 Maple Street. (1925 - 1937)

*** Miss Annabelle Eastman is a nurse Clark's Drug Store. She rooms on Elm Street

*** Carl G. Eastman is a plumber at RR Scruggs. Carl and Gertrude A. Eastman have a home at 9 Highland Street. (1925) Carl has a home in Benton, NH. (1935-37)

*** Carl G. Eastman and Katherine C. Eastman removed to Burlington, Vermont, prior to 1953.

*** Reverend Forrest L. Eastman is Rector at the Episcopal Church, on School Street. (1943)

*** Dr. Cyrus Eastman practiced medicine in Woodsville from 1946 until his retirement in 1971. His home, and office, at 105 Central Street, was between the fire station and the Lovejoy Block. (Siprelle Photo Studio - Tuck's Press) Dr. Cyrus Eastman was born in Groton Vermont and graduated from the University of Vermont Medical School in 1930. He practiced in Monroe, NH from 1931 until 1941 when he entered the service, serving in the First Infantry. He practiced in both the original Cottage Hospital on River Road and the new one on Swiftwater Road in Woodsville. Dr. Eastman retired in 1976 and lived until 1980.

*** Rev. Forrest L. Eastman is rector at St. Luke's Episcopal Church. The Reverend and Alice G. Eastman live at 10 Maple Street. (1929-1945)

*** Harold and Janet H. Eastman removed to Connecticut, prior to 1953.

*** Harry E. Eastman is a laborer at Acer Lumber Company. Harry and Eliza J. Eastman have a home at 22 Beech Street. (1925)

*** Herbert J. Eastman is a student at Mt. Herman School in Mass., and boarding at 31 Highland Street, the home of John E. Eastman. (1935-37)

*** John E. Eastman is retired. He and Cora M. Eastman board at 31 Highland Street. (1935-37) John is retired and the Eastman's are living at 9a Perkins Place. (1953 - 1955)

John Eastman passed away prior to 1956. Dora is residing at 9 Perkins Place. (1956 - 1958)

*** Miss Marion Eastman is a teacher at Woodsville High School. Marion is rooming at 17 Beech Street, the home of Fred Strobridge, and at Lincoln, NH. (1929-37)

*** Miss Mildred V. Eastman is a telephone operator at White Mountain Telephone Company, Pleasant Street, second floor of the Odd Fellows Block.

Mildred is boarding at 22 Beech Street, the home of Harry E. Eastman. (1925)

*** Milo D. Eastman is a substitute mail carrier for James (Jimmie) Battis in 1942 and a turnkey at the Grafton County Farm. Milo has a home in Bath, NH. (1953 - 1955)

*** Oliver Davis Eastman, MD., born July 8th, (1808)?? in Senora California. Married Addie Davis 12-14-1882. Settled in Woodsville, in 1884, after practicing medicine in Piermont. The doctor graduated from Dartmouth Medical School in 1882. Dr. Eastman practiced in the Mulliken Block, Central Street, and the Eastmans have a home at 17 Maple Street (1915) His home was on Maple Street and the practice was in the Opera Block. He was chairman of the Woodsville School Board and died in 1922. The Eastmans had 5 children:

- 1) D. K. born 1-8-1884 Graduate Cornell veterinarian
- 2) Oliver Newell born in Woodsville 8-3-1885, Dr. in Burlington, Vt.
- 3) Burns Rush born in Woodsville 8-22-1887
- 4) Abel Earl born in Woodsville 5-15-1890 died 10-6-1895) Milo Donald born in Woodsville 2-2-1892

*** Paul Eastman is a crew foreman for the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, on Pleasant Street, the Odd Fellows Block, room #1. Paul and Verna have a home at 52 Park Street. (1935-37)

*** Seth N. Eastman is a partner in Walker and Eastman motor sales at 97 Central Street. They had operated, briefly, on North Court Street. Seth boards at 7a Pine Street, the home of Raymond B. Hoar. (1935-37)

Edes ... Francis P. Edes is an attorney in the Opera Block. Francis and Edna have a home in Wells River, Vermont. Edna is a stenographer at 13 Pleasant Street. (1953 - 1955) Francis is in partnership with Leonard S. Sawyer, Edes & Sawyer, at 65 Central Street, the Opera Block, rooms 3 and 4. (1956 - 1958) In 1959 the firm was listed as Francis P. Edes and Robert H. Hobbs.

Edson ... Vernon H. Edson is an osteopathic physician at 35 Central Street, the Sargent Block. Vernon and Anna B. Edson have a home at 19 Elm Street. (1925 - 1937)

Eggleston ... Abner Eggleston is a farmhand and rooms at R. Butsons on Bath/Haverhill Road (1915).

Elliott ...

*** Clyde Elliott is a yardman at Newman Lumber Company. Clyde resides in Lisbon, NH,. (1956 - 1958)

*** Russell D. Elliott is a lineman for Green Mountain Power Company. Russell and Clarissa A. Elliott live at 21 Pleasant Street. (1953 - 1958)

*** William W. Elliott is a foreman at 35 Central Street, the Sargent Block. (1953 - 1955)

Ellsworth ...

*** Arthur H. and Gladys L. Ellsworth removed to Piermont, New Hampshire, prior to 1953.

*** Miss E. Maude Ellsworth is a waitress in the Sargent Block and rooms at H.B. Ellsworth's Central Street (1915).

*** Henry B. Ellsworth is a freight handler for the B&M RR. He and Winifred have a house on Central Street (1915).

Elms ... Alice Elms, widow of Charles V. Elms, is the housekeeper at 51 Park Street, the home of Fred R. Campbell. (1953 - 1955) Alice is living at 3 Smith Street. (1956 - 1958)

Elquist ... Mrs. Janice Elquist is boarding at 10 Pleasant Street, the home of Mrs. Jeanette L. Spofford. (1953 -1955) Janice removed to Brattleboro, Vermont, prior to 1956.

Emerson ...

*** George A. Emerson is a farmer and rooms at Viola Cushman's on Cherry Street (1915).

*** George M. Emerson is an employee of the railroad, boarding at Viola E. Cushman's on Cherry Street. (1929-31) George is boarding at 29 Highland Street, the home of Mrs. Nila L. Leach. (1935-37)

Emery ...

*** Charles S. Emery is a plumber for Rhett R. Scruggs. He and Blanche have a house at 19 Pleasant Street. (1915) Charles died on July 12th, 1933. His widow, Angie S. Emery, has a home at 11 highland Street. (1935-37)

*** Miss Doris A. Emery is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding at 117 Central Street, the home of Harry H. Emery. (1929-31)

*** Miss Edith Emery is teaching English and Chorus at Woodsville High School. 1966-1967

*** George E. Emery is a clerk at AFM&S. George and Sarah G. have a house at 19 Pleasant Street. (1915) George E. Emery, born February 4th, 1855, was a resident of Woodsville for 43 years. He was a clerk and plumber, a Democrat and a Mason. He died on 5-17-1919. (1919)

*** Harry H. Emery is a carpenter. Harry and Eca M. Emery have a home at 117 Central Street. (1929-31)

*** Miss Ida M. Emery removed to Tilton, NH, prior to 1931.

*** Miss Lois G. Emery is a clerk at Woodsville National Bank, boarding in Monroe, NH. (1929-31)

*** Wells D. Emery has removed from this town prior to 1931.

Enderson ... Arthur C. Enderson is a section hand for the B&M railroad. Arthur and Hattie have a house on Park Street (1915).

England ... Miss Ada M. England is a stenographer for the Farm Bureau, in the Odd Fellows Block, room #7. Ada boards in Wells River, Vermont. (1925) Ada is boarding at 9 Perkins Place, by the second crossing. (1929-37)

Enterprise Steam Press ... This steam laundry was operated by G. E. White in 1906. On a 1906 invoice from East Ryegate, with over a dozen individuals listed on the invoice, the largest amount on the bill was for 82 cents!

Episcopal Church ... Reverend Forrest L. Eastman is Rector at the Episcopal Church, on School Street. (1943)

Rectors are: W. B. T/ Smith 1878-1880, W. H. Burbank 1880-1884, H. A. Remick 1884-1892, A. W. Jenks 1892-1895, James C. Flanders 1895-1905, Frederick C. Cowper 1905-1913, George R. Savage 1913-1915, Alaxander A. Cairnes 1916-1923, Ean A. R. McDonald 1923-1926, Eldred May 1926-1929, Forrest Eastman 1929-1945, Harvie Zuckerman interim 1946-1947, Robert Porter 1948-1952, Frank W. Cole 1953-1956, George Magoon 1957-1962, William Thompson 1962 1971, Gary Michener 1971-1974, William Krogstadt 1974-1981, Francis Potter 1982-1985, Thomas C. Baxter 1984-1986, Todd Hall 1986-1997, A. Dickerson Salmon 1998-)

Episcopal Parish House ... The building of the Episcopal Parish House , at 121 Central Street, was accomplished in 1914. It has long been the center for many community functions. (1919 - 2008)

Estes ...

*** Howard Estes is truck driver at 38 Railroad Street, Armour Wholesale Meat Company. Howard resides in Bath, NH. (1956 - 1958) Neil and Jacquelyn R. Estes removed to 35 College Parkway, Winooski, Vermont, prior to 1956.

*** Neil L. Estes is in the U. S. Air Force. Mrs. Neil (Jacquelyn R.) Estes is a bookkeeper for T. Borden Walker, dealing in furniture. Jacquelyn is boarding at A. J. Beaton's on Melody Lane. (1953 - 1955)

Evans ...

*** Eli L. Evans died on March 4th, 1880. He settled in Woodsville after marrying Betsey King on 3-19-1887. Betsey was Russell King's sister.

*** Donald Evans is teaching U. S. History, Contemporary Problems and Remedial English at Woodsville High School, (1959-1963) and Principal from 1964 until 1988.

*** George Evans was a painter. He rented the addition to Clem Bailey's blacksmith-wheelwright building on Oak Hill, in 1900.

*** Mrs. Sarah J. Evans is a matron at 14 Maple Street, the home for the Aged. Sarah is the widow of John Evans. (1929 - 1955)

*** Solon S. Evans was the postmaster in Woodsville during 1889-1897. Solon married Mary W. Gale, from west Bath. They had two children. John S. Evans was the billing clerk in the railroad freight office and daughter Madge was a clerk in the post office.

The post office was moved from the Weeks Block to the Opera Block, South Court Street side, during his administration as postmaster. The present post office, on South Court Street, was built in 1941.

Solon Evans and son John were also in the poultry business. They had a 15 x 60 foot duck house and a brooder house with an incubator in the cellar. They realized a goodly amount in sales from their poultry stock.
