*** Ray S. Jenkins is a clerk at the Holbrook Grocery Co. on Railroad Street. He rooms at E. A. Smith's on Walnut Street (1915). Listed as having a house at 17 beech Street in 1919.

*** Walter Jenkins is employed in Wells River. Walter resides at 43 Central Street, in the Henderson Hotel. (1956 - 1958)

Jenks ... A. W. Jenks was rector at St. Luke's Episcopal church. (1892-1895)

Jenness ...

*** John W. Jenness is a freight brakeman for the B&M railroad. John and Emma L. Jenness have a house at 18 King Street. (1915) (1919) 13 King Street in 1925. John Jenness's widow, Emma L. Jenness, removed to 171 Ocean Street, South Portland, Me., prior to 1931.

*** George Jenness, removed to 171 Ocean Street, South Portland, Me., prior to 1931.

Jerue ... John Jerue is a brakeman on the railroad. John and Maud have a home at 9 Locust Street.

*** Harold E. Jewett is an employee of the B&M railroad. He boards at 32 Mill Street. (1919) Harold is now a freight handler ... he and Elizabeth H. Jewett have a home at 12 Pleasant Street. (1929-31)

*** Miss Irene E. Jewett is an assistant agent for the Boys and Girls Club at 13 Pleasant Street, the Odd Fellows Block, room #7. Irene is boarding on King Street. (1935 - 1937)

John L. Woods Club ... John L Woods Club was on one of the upper floors of the Opera Block in 1898.

John s Sport Shop ... Operated by John Fullerton Jr. at the corner of Elm and Central Streets, across from the Highland Street crossing. Advertised Guns, Fishing, Camping, Boating, Ski-Doo. 1966-1967 747-2343

*** Miss Christine Johnsen is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding with her parents, Norman and Marta Linnea Johnsen at 14 Pine Street. (1953 - 1955) Christine is a student at the University of NH and residing at 14 Pine Street. (1956 - 1958)

*** Miss Norma Johnsen is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding with her parents, Norman and Marta Linnea Johnsen at 14 Pine Street. (1956 - 1958)

*** Norman L. Johnsen is a cashier at 38 Railroad Street, Armour Wholesale Meat Company. Norman and Marta Linnea Johnsen have a home at 77 Central Street. (1929-31) Norman is a salesman for Armour Wholesale Meat Company, at 38 Railroad Street. Norman and Marta Linnea Johnsen have a home at Perkins Place. (1935 -1937) Norman and Marta Linnea Johnsen have a home at 14 Pine Street. (1953 - 1955)

***** Albert I. Johnson is boarding at 56 South Court Street, the home of Frank A. Johnson. (1953 - 1955) Albert is residing at Park Street. (1956 - 1958)**

***** Annie Johnson became superintendent of the Cottage Hospital on River Road, in Woodsville, in 1947.**

Annie graduated from Gifford Memorial Hospital in Randolph, Vermont, 1927, where she served as head nurse for a year.

Annie Johnson came to Woodsville in 1930 and did private duty nursing for over 20 years before becoming head nurse at the County Farm Hospital where she worked for five years.

Annie Johnson joined the Cottage Hospital staff in 1945 and became superintendent until her retirement in 1963.

The hospital was once a stage coach tavern called the Cobleigh. The portion of the hospital with the pitch roof with three windows is the part that was the old Cobleigh Tavern.

Annie Johnson worked in the new hospital, on Swiftwater Road, for three years before her retirement.

Annie Johnson passed away in 1994.

***** Austin Johnson is a carpenter, rooming at 1 Connecticut Street. (1929-31)**

***** Miss Barbara Johnson is employed by the Department of Public Welfare and lives on the old Bath Road. (1953 - 1958)**

***** Bernard Johnson is a foreman at 20 Central Street, Bailey Buick Garage. Bernard and Avis Johnson have a home at 7 Walnut Street. (1953 - 1958)**

***** Charles W. Johnson purchased a restaurant from A. H. Vallee in 1893. A. H. Vallee had operated the restaurant in the Music Hall building on Pleasant Street, between the original Odd Fellows building and Weeks Block, on the corner of Pleasant and Central Streets. Vallee evidently ran the business for a few years before selling to Charles W. Johnson. The building burned in 1901.**

***** Christie H. Johnson is a carpenter. He and Julie H. Johnson have a house at 56 Court Street. (1915) (1919) (1925-31) Julia is deceased prior to 1931.**

***** David E. Johnson is a plumber, employed at 27 South Court Street, Rhett Scruggs hardware and plumbing. David has a house in**

Bath, NH. (1935 - 1937) Elsie Lamarre Johnson worked the summer of 1941 in North Woodstock, at Mt. Adams Hotel.

David is a plumber employed at 89 Central Street, in the Gobeille Block, Dave and Elsie live at 13 Highland Street. (1953 - 1955) David and Elsie L. Johnson owned and operated Johnson Electric at 27-31 Central Street, in the Tilton Block. They took over the space previously occupied by Pat Hill as the Firestone Store.

Dave and Elsie ran the store from 1970 until 1979. Dave was aggressive and on slow days he would go door to door making a days wages selling light bulbs! Elsie and Dave lived on Pleasant Street and Elsie's father was Eugene Lamarre. David is an employee of Walker Enterprises, at the Johnsons' are residing at 29 Highland Street. (1956 - 1958)

***** David H. Johnson is a farmhand at F. P. Wells farm on the Swiftwater-Benton Road, RFD #2. (1919)**

***** Davis Johnson, Jr. and Katie Johnson operated Pyramid Rock & Mineral Shop at 38 Highland Street. (1990's)**

***** Florence L. Johnson, widow of Raymond Johnson, is living in her home at 133 Central Street. (1925) Florence removed to 134 Court Street, Laconia, NH, prior to 1931.**

***** Frank A. Johnson is a carpenter. Frank and Alma C. Johnson have a home at 56 South Court Street. (1935 - 1937) Frank is retired and the Johnson's are still living at 56 South Court Street. (1953-55) The Johnsons' have a son Roden.**

***** Frank W. Johnson is a conductor on the B&M railroad and is a resident of Woodsville. (1898)**

***** George Johnson is retired and boarding at 34 King Street, the home of Harold O. Taylor. (1953 - 1955)**

***** Howard R. Johnson is foreman at the engine house. Howard and Ruth H. Johnson have a home at 151 Central Street. (1929-31) The Johnsons' removed to Lyndonville, Vermont, prior to 1935.**

***** Miss Irene E. Johnson is a stenographer at Clark's Institute for the Deaf, in Mass., Irene is boarding at 7 Walnut Street. (1953 - 1955)**

*** James Johnson is a car inspector for the railroad. James and Georgianna M. Johnson are boarding at 68 Park Street, the home of Ernest R. Ball. (1925)

*** Oscar A. Johnson is an attendant at the Tydol gas station, boarding with Frank and Alma C. Johnson at 56 South Court Street. (1935 - 1937) He is employed in Worcester, Mass., in 1942. Olive and son, Robert, plan on removing to Worcester, very soon. (1942) Oscar is a plumber at 27 Central Street, Trottier's Home Appliances. Olive is a Registered nurse at Cottage Hospital. Oscar and Olive B Johnson have a home at 25 Park Lane. (1953 - 1958) Oscar has two brothers, Roydon and Henry.

*** Oscar D. Johnson purchased the Parker House from Hawkins and Nutting in 1887. In 1889 the roof of the el was raised and 8 more rooms were added. Around 1890 Johnson sold the hotel to W. A. Richardson. O. D. Johnson is manager of the Johnson House, previously called Central House, at 199 Central Street. (1892-1893)

*** Ray Johnson is a brakeman on the railroad. Ray boards at 7 Cherry Street. (1919)

*** Roy C. Johnson is boarding with Frank and Alma C. Johnson have a home at 56 South Court Street. (1935 - 1937)

*** Royden Johnson is serving in Camp Branding, in Florida. (1942)

*** Miss Shirley Johnson is a clerk for Edes and Sawyer, law office. Shirley resides at 7a Walnut Street. (1956 - 1958)

*** William A. Johnson is a car inspector for the railroad and is boarding at 42 Ammonoosuc Street, the home of Frank Brown. (1925)

Johnson Educator Food Company ... Floyd G. Davison, manager, 38 Railroad Street. (1935 - 1937)

Johnson Lumber Mill ... (August of 1942) is located on the lot where the old trotting park once stood. It is near the corner of rt. 10 and Smith Street (rt. 302) and plans to operate for five years cutting out 3 million feet of lumber a year.

Johnson s Service Station ... This business operated on the corner of Smith and Beech Streets, the former Fullerton Bros. Esso station. The Johnsons business was mostly with motorcyclists,

in 1956-1957. The building was torn down in in 1957 and Slim Hazlett opened a City Service Station here in 1957.

***** William H. Jolin is a turn table operator for the railroad. William and Flora M. Jolin have a home at 4 Mill Street. (1925) The Jolin's are residing on Wilson Ave. (1929-31)**

William Jolin is a laborer and the Jolins' still live on Wilson Avenue. (1935 - 1937) William is employed by the Cottage Hospital. William and Flora live on Bath Road. (1953 - 1958)

***** Zerrie Jolin is a chef and rooms at J. A. Guiettes off Haverhill Road (1915). Zerrie Jolin has removed to Jefferson, NH. (1919)**

Jones ...

***** Anthony K. Jones is employed at 15 North Court Street, C. A. Butson's meats and provisions store. Anthony and Barbara H. Jones have a home at 19 Ammonoosuc Street. (1935 - 1937) Barbara H. Jones is teaching at Carbee School. (1942 - 1943) Anthony is a trainman and Barbara is a clerk at 15 North Court Street, People's Market and a kindergarten teacher. The Jones' are living at 6 Maple Street. (1953 - 1955) Barbara is teaching kindergarten. (1956 - 1958)**

***** Jennie L. Jones, widow of Harry H. Jones, has a home at 10 Highland Street. (1953 - 1955) Jennie Jones died in September, 1955.**

***** Miss Margery C. Jones is boarding at 6 Pine Street, at the home of her parents. (1953 - 1955) Margery is a medical secretary in Concord, NH, residing at 6 Maple Street. (1956 - 1958)**

***** Richard A. Jones is a student at NH University, residing at 6 Maple Street. (1956 - 1958)**

***** Robert A. Jones is a Grafton County Commissioner. Robert has a home in Lebanon, NH. (1953 - 1958)**

***** W. A. Jones operates a book printing business. (1882)**

***** Albert H. Jordan is a carpenter. Albert and Florence C. Jordan reside at 13 Maple Street.(1956 - 1958)**

***** Clyde W. Jordan is a stone mason and lives on Monroe Road. tele in 1957 was 7-2413. Arnold and Gerald were two of the jordan boys.**

***** Leslie G. Jordan is an engineer for the B&M railroad and rooms in Woodsville (1915). Leslie Jordan has removed to Berlin, NH. (1919) Leslie G. and Nellie E. Jordan have a home at 37 Smith Street. (1925-31) Leslie and Mary Jordan have a home at 37 Smith Street. (1935 - 1937)**

***** Mrs. Lillian A. Jordan has removed to Lancaster, NH. (1919)**

***Joy ...* Burton A. Joy is a barber in G. P. Blake's barber shop. Burton and Lens D. Joy have a house on Elm Street (1915). Listed as having a house at 117 Central Street in 1919.**

Judd ...

***** Benjamin Judd is a woodworker at L. E. Mason's. Benjamin and Linda Streeter Judd have a house at 7 Central Street, just off the bridge.**

(1919) Benjamin, born in Lisbon on 3-5-1859 removed to Franconia in 1886 and married Linda Streeter. The Judd's removed to Woodsville in 1900 and to Wells River a few years later. They had six children. One died at childbirth. Benjamin Judd died on 11-1334.

***** Carl Judd is an electrician boarding with Benjamin Judd out 7 Central Street. (1919) Carl and Edith Judd removed to Wells River prior to 1931.**

***** Mrs. Eva V. Judd is a housekeeper for R. M. Wheeler on Park Lane. (1929-31) Eva has a home at 3 Connecticut Street. (1935 - 1937)**

***** Henry M. Judd died June 11th, 1935.**

***** Jennie N. Judd, widow of Henry W. Judd, is housekeeper for H. M. Judd, a farmer on Cutting Hill in Pike, NH, (1929-31)**

***** Raymond Judd is a student at Woodsville High School, boarding at 3 Connecticut Street, the home of Mrs. Eva V. Judd. (1935 - 1937)**

***** Mrs. Vorrion E. Judd passed away on July 20th, 1951.**
